While you aren't required to dress in costume to attend the show, we encourage it to further enhancing your fun with us. Try to do as many of the things on this list as you can...

	Mandrake's Mystery: Upon entry to the Faire be sure to ask the Greeters for a copy of Mandrake's Mystery. This free game will have you laughing all day as you attempt to solve a game of "Renaissance Clue" by interacting with various performers. This one is a must if you want to have more fun! There are new mysteries every weekend of the show.
	Secret Unicorn Game: We've hidden the Faire Unicorn Logo in over 60 different locations. Can you find them all? Write your answers on the back of this itinerary. Good luck!
	Entertainment Program & Schedule: If you weren't handed a free Entertainment Program and Schedule of Events when you walked into the Faire be sure to get one from our Greeters at the entry gate. This will give you a summary of all performers and when and where they are performing.
	Watch the Shows: It can take up to 6 straight days to see every show at the Faire so if you are only planning to visit once, stop by our Souvenir Booth and attendants them for show suggestions. Please note: Some shows contain humor and language that may be inappropriate for your children. These shows will announce this prior to starting.
	Volunteer a Friend: Many of our performances encourage audience participation. If a show asks for a volunteer be the first to volunteer a friend and join in the fun. We want to make your day with us as memorable as possible and this will help.
	Interact with our Street Cast: Take a moment to chat with our costumed actors. Ask them what they do in the village and engage them in conversation. They want to talk to you and help you step back in time.
	Stay for Halloween Knights: On certain evenings the Faire stays open late for a special Halloween event. Stay for the haunted joust, fire shows, zombie walk-and-dance and more.
	Dance with us: Every day of the Faire we teach various dances you'd see at an old-world festival or a castle court. Check your schedule and join us as we teach you the steps of courtly dance.
	Smite the Knight: Challenge a friend to a duel and take arms in our "Smite the Knight" ring located at the Hitting & Stabbing Emporium. Many games at the H&SE are open to "friendly" competitions.
	Eat a Turkey Leg: Get your hands on a delectable turkey leg from the Fin and Feather Tavern and feast away like you're a king! Treat yourself to a variety of food and drink on this special day – you deserve it!
	Explore the Marketplace: Browse through all of our merchant shops and look for things that catch your eye. From jewelry, housewares, and clothing to swords, armor, collectibles, and toys there is something for everyone at the Faire.
	See the Joust: Take the time to see armored knights on horseback trying to knock each other off with colored lances. Cheer for your favorite knight. The most attended joust of the day is the final joust which is a *must-see* show.
	Final Sing: Attend the Final Sing which contains creative (and often humorous) songs and skits.
	Get a Memento: Stop by our Souvenir Booth on your way out of the Faire and purchase a memento of your first faire experience. We recommend our quality t-shirts and sweatshirts. If you are planning to return to the Faire consider purchasing a season pass while you're there and come back to enjoy many more days of fun with us.
